



Admission Requirements (excerpts) for the University of Manitoba Bachelor of Education Program

Providence University College is an excellent place at which to fulfill the entrance requirements for education studies at universities in Canada. This information is specific to the Faculty of Education at the University of Manitoba (U of M). Students will want to check the website of the university of their choice for information on respective entrance requirements. For the U of M, the address for information entrance requirements to the Faculty of Education is www.umanitoba.ca/educ/

The U of M B.Ed. program is an "after-degree" (60 credit hour) program. All students must have completed a recognized degree (minimum of 90 credit hour program) by April of the year of application to the B.Ed. program.

As of June 22, 2011 the U of M Senate Committee has passed the following motion that the Faculty of Education be allowed to accept applicants for admission to its After-Degree Bachelor of Education Program who present approved or "select" degrees earned at Booth College and Providence University College (i.e., degrees recognized by the relevant political

jurisdiction, in this case the province of Manitoba) when those degrees include at least 60 hours of acceptable academic credit (i.e., credit normally acceptable for transfer to University of Manitoba programs).

A Providence degree is recognized by the U of M. Applications are processed on the basis of competitive admission. Students must also have completed:

- A teachable major (see following table)
- A teachable minor (see following table)
- Early or Middle Years breadth requirements (see following table)
- Additional "Selection requirements" (see following table)

A minimum grade of "C" (2.0) is required in all courses that are used toward teachable majors, minors and/or breadth requirements.
